*GROSS ANNUAL INCOME: Annual gross income is what you receive before taxes and other deductions.

**HOUSEHOLD: All people who occupy a housing unit. A household includes the related family members and all the unrelated people, if any, such as lodgers, foster children, wards, or employees who share the housing unit. A person living alone in a housing unit, or a group of unrelated people sharing the housing unit such as partners or roomers, is also counted as a household.
