## EWEB advisory team applications available

Today is the first day that people can apply to serve on a nine-member team that will advise the Eugene Water & Electric Board on how to redevelop much of the utility's choice riverfront property.

The acreage is expected to be available after EWEB moves its operations complex to a new location in west Eugene. EWEB's headquarters building and steam plant will remain along the river east of downtown.

Applications can be picked up at EWEB offices, 500 E. Fourth Ave., and should be available on the utility's Web site — [www.eweb.org](http://www.eweb.org) — later today. EWEB commissioners approved the application form Tuesday night.

Interest in serving on the committee appears to be high, said Mark Oberle, EWEB property manager. Applications will be accepted through March 28, and EWEB commissioners hope to choose five of the nine members on April 15. The City Council will then select the four others.

Commissioners said the selections are so important that they want to personally interview committee finalists. Applicants must be an EWEB customer or Eugene resident.
