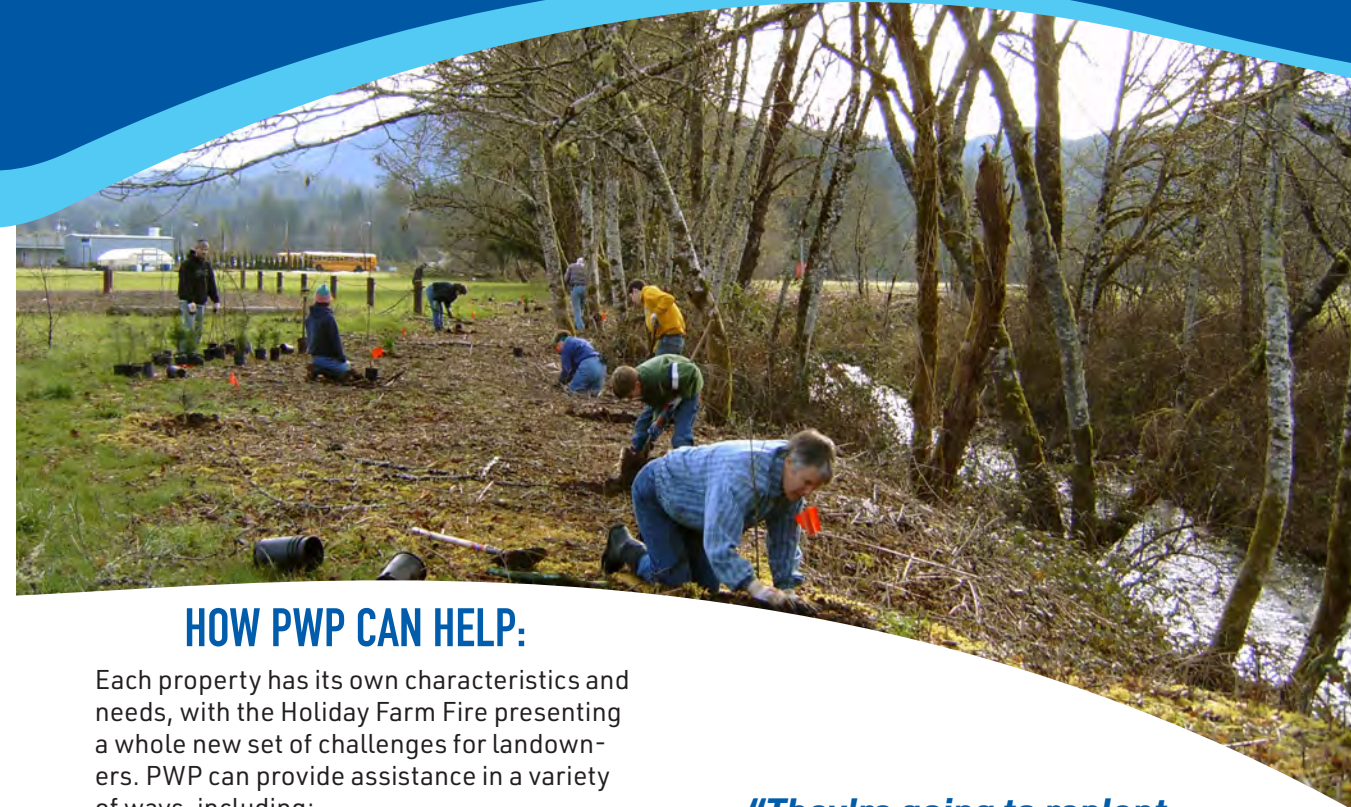

Pure Water Partners (PWP) is a collective of local organizations working alongside landowners like you to protect our community's vital water sources. Together, we are ensuring the future of pure water for Oregonians.

Here in Lane County, we are fortunate to have abundant, clean and pure water resources. Our forests, porous volcanic rock and streamside vegetation filter the rain and snow. The result is crystal-clear streams and rivers that deliver some of the cleanest drinking water in the nation.

With a changing climate and growing population, our region faces developing challenges to water quality. To continue to safeguard drinking water purity and protect our watersheds, the Eugene Water & Electric Board joined with other watershed stewardship groups to create the Pure Water Partners program.



HOW PWP CAN HELP:

Each property has its own characteristics and needs, with the Holiday Farm Fire presenting a whole new set of challenges for landowners. PWP can provide assistance in a variety of ways, including:

- Property assessments to evaluate opportunities for replanting, controlling invasive species, reducing fire fuel loads, and mitigating erosion
- Complimentary consultation on watershed-friendly and Firewise landscaping practices
- Incentives for continued protection of healthy streamside properties.

We work with all landowners in the watershed upstream of EWEB's Hayden Bridge drinking water intake.
